MESSAGE FROM MR FARRELL

Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you to parents and carers who attended Parents' Evening this week.

It was a valuable opportunity for teachers and families to talk together about children's learning and wellbeing. We know that when school and home work in partnership, children benefit most, and we really appreciate the time you took to engage in these conversations. We would also like to remind families of our open-door approach. If you have a concern or something you are worried about, please do contact the school and we will be happy to arrange a time to meet and talk things through.

Following the parent consultation on homework at the end of the last academic year, we would like to take this opportunity to outline again expectations around homework. Although the policy had not yet been formally written at that point, the key expectations were discussed and have since been shared with families. As outlined, there is a balance of optional homework alongside core weekly expectations. One of these core expectations for Key Stage 2 pupils is regular practice of times tables using Times Tables Rockstars (TTRS).

Secure times table knowledge is crucial to children's success in mathematics. Without it, pupils can find many areas significantly more difficult, including fractions, percentages, ratio and algebra. This becomes even more important as children move into secondary school, where fluency is assumed and lessons move at pace. For this reason, times tables were not listed as an optional element of homework – they are fundamental to children reaching their full potential in maths.

TTRS works because it provides regular, short bursts of repetition and recall, and over the years I have seen first-hand how pupils with strong times table knowledge go on to thrive in maths with greater confidence and success. Every child has a TTRS login, and the minimum expectation can be met with as little as four minutes a day. 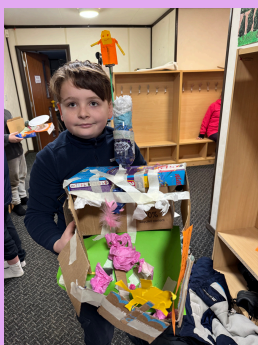
CLASS 4
