# CLASSROOM NEWS

## CLASS 3

Over the past two weeks in Science, the children carried out a fun investigation using ramps and toy cars. They tested how far the cars travelled across different surfaces, including card, felt, cotton wool, tin foil and grass. The children made careful observations and compared which materials allowed the cars to travel the furthest (and which slowed them down the most!).

This week, we have been exploring the science behind our results, focusing on why different surfaces affected the cars' movement and what this teaches us about forces.



## CLASS 4

As part of Class 4's 'Animals including Humans' topic in Science, Class 4 have enjoyed two memorable experiences in the last two weeks! Firstly, they been learning about the functions of the different organs in our digestive system, and the stages of digestion by using a model. We broke up a mixture food using whisks and water (representing our teeth and saliva, before pouring the food down a pair of tights, representing the oesophagus and intestines, end excreting the waste through the end of the tights!

Additionally, they have learned about different types of human teeth, and dental health. We were delighted to welcome a visiting dentist who talked to us about looking after our teeth. The class then took part the Awesome Smiles workshop, which other classes also experienced throughout the day.



## CLASS 5

Year 5 had great fun learning about air resistance in Science. We designed an experiment where the independent variable was the size of the parachute, measuring which parachute took the longest to reach the ground. This led to interesting discussions about how shape and surface area affect air resistance, and how these ideas link to real-world transport design and environmental issues such as fuel efficiency and reducing pollution.



## CLASS 6

Year 6 have thoroughly enjoyed a fantastic week of PE lessons. Pupils worked hard to develop their teamwork and communication skills through a range of activities, showing great cooperation and enthusiasm. They also took part in an exciting gymnastics taster session, where they loved exploring new movements and challenging themselves in a fun and supportive environment.

## E Safety: Protecting Ourselves Online

### Sharing Photos Safely

Sharing photos online can seem fun, but children may not realise the risks.

Photos can reveal hidden personal details, like school uniforms, street signs, or family members, which can be misused. Encourage children to pause and ask: Would I be happy for a teacher or grandparent to see this photo? If the answer is no, it shouldn't be shared. The NSPCC "Share Aware" page has clear, age-appropriate advice for families on safer photo sharing.
