CLASSROOM NEWS

CLASS R

Class R have been learning all about penguins! The children have enjoyed hearing about all the different types of penguins that live in Antarctica. We have been reading the book 'Jonty Gentoo' by Julia Donaldson, and have explored lots of different penguin-related activities. These include drawing our own penguin colonies on big paper, making playdough penguins, creating a macaroni penguin using...yes you've guessed it....macaroni, and much more! The children were especially excited to go 'penguin spotting' using the binoculars they had made - find the penguin hidden somewhere in the classroom, and write its name on your clipboard. All in the name of Antarctic Research!



CLASS 1

Year 1 have had a very busy and exciting week! In Maths, we have been learning about place value, using number lines and finding one more and one less than different numbers. In English, the children have been developing their writing skills by creating setting descriptions, character descriptions, and are now beginning to write about different places in London. In Geography, we are continuing our work on maps and learning how to use simple directional language. In Art, the children have been exploring 3D structures and this week worked collaboratively to build the Chinese Bridge in Godmanchester using newspaper. Everyone has worked incredibly hard, and we are very proud of them.



CLASS 2

We have had a busy few weeks in year 2. We enjoyed a trip to Pinnies where we used our maths knowledge to buy a drink, cake and fruit by counting out our money. We then went out and about in Godmanchester again to conduct a traffic survey and examined the river as a habitat for living things. We have also been continuing to enjoy our Forest School sessions learning lots of new skills.
