On Monday evening, the Full Governing Body ratified our FaceBook Policy. A summary of the details are as follows:

- 1. Posts and Comments:
- o Only school-appointed administrators will post content. We encourage parents to like and share posts respectfully.
 - o Please do not name or discuss specific children on the page. For concerns, contact the school directly.
 - 2. Photos and Videos:
 - o Only authorised staff can upload photos or videos, and children will never be tagged or named.
 - o Parents must complete a permission form for any use of their child's images on the page.
 - 3. Moderation:
 - o The page is monitored daily, and any inappropriate content will be addressed immediately.
 - The Facebook messaging feature is turned off, so for any issues, please contact the school directly.
 4. Misuse:
- o Inappropriate comments will be recorded and may result in removal or further action, including bans for repeated offenses.
 - 5. Restrictions:
- o No advertising, negative feedback, or tagging of children is allowed. Parents are also reminded not to send friend requests to staff members or mention them negatively.

I would be grateful if all parents, carers and members of the community could work together to respect and follow the rules within this policy so that we can continue sharing the great work achieved by the children at St. Anne's.

We made two ovens with a variable (one with foil) to compare the difference. The temperature rose by 10 degrees from 24 to 34 degrees, melting the chocolate chips!
